GUIDELINES FOR ABSTRACT SUBMISSION

Please read carefully the guidelines below for abstract submission.

1. Rules for abstract submission

- A. All abstracts must be submitted online through the IFBLS 2022 website only at www.ifbbs2022.org. Your abstract submission will be acknowledged automatically by email. FAX OR EMAIL SUBMISSIONS WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED.
- B. Please follow the detailed instructions about the abstract submission below, and carefully make sure to complete all sections at the online abstract submission. If all sections are not completed, your abstract submission will NOT be accepted.
- C. Authors are required to indicate their preference on the type of presentation between oral or poster presentation by checking the appropriate box on the submission page. The IFBLS 2022 Scientific Committee, however, reserves the right to make the final decision on the type of presentation for all abstracts.
- D. Acceptance or rejection of abstracts will be based on rankings given by a peer review of experts in the associated subspecialties. Notification of acceptance will be sent to the author by email. The reviewing process is confidential, and the decision is final and cannot be appealed.
- E. Submission of an abstract indicates acceptance of and compliance with the abstract submission rules and the scientific validity of the presentation, and that all authors have read and approved the abstract and its contents.
- F. All accepted abstracts will be published in the official abstract book and/or abstract USB and distributed to all delegates. Abstracts will be published exactly as submitted. Errors will not be amended by the organizing committee.
- G. Accepted abstracts are official documents of the meeting. The presenting author must register, attend the meeting and present the abstracts as scheduled. The presenting author must register at the time of acceptance of the abstract. Accepted abstracts whose presenting author does not register and pay in full by August 31, 2022, will not be published.
- H. The IFBLS 2022 Scientific Committee reserves the right to reject abstracts that do not observe the abstract submission rules mentioned above.
- I. Modifications may be made at any time until the abstract submission deadline of July 31, 2022.
- J. Instructions on the preparation of presentations will be included with the notification of acceptance.

2. Instructions for abstract preparation

- A. **Language:** Abstracts must be written and presented in English.
- B. **Title:** Use a concise title that indicates the content of the abstract. The complete title should not exceed **30 words**. Refrain from using abbreviations in the title.
- C. **Author:** Names and surnames for all co-authors must be provided. Do not include degrees or titles.
- D. **Institution:** Each author must be listed by department, institution, city, and country.
- E. **Contents:**
 - Abstracts should not exceed **350 words** and must be in the form of **Abstract Template**.
 - Contents may be organized as the author sees fit, though they should include the purpose of the study, the methods used, a summary of the results and the conclusion reached. It is not satisfactory to simply state that "The result will be discussed."
 - **No tables, figures, graphs, and references are allowed.**
 - Animated images and animations are not permitted and will be non-functioning.
 - All abbreviations must be defined in first use. Only standard abbreviations may be used without definition. Data must be given in units (An international metric system is preferred) widely used in literature.
 - Abstracts will be reproduced exactly as submitted and will not be edited in any way. The authors are responsible for all spelling, grammatical or scientific errors.
- F. **Keywords:** A minimum of three keywords must be entered in alphabetical order, and up to five keywords.
- G. **Acknowledgement:** Funding source can be entered where applicable.

3. Topics & Subtopics

For reviewing and scheduling purposes, abstracts will be divided into thematic areas. Please select the most appropriate topic and subtopic classification to which your abstract belongs to. The Scientific Committee will attempt to respect the authors' choice regarding their self-assignment of a topic and a subtopic, but it reserves the right to change the topic and subtopic classifications to achieve a well-balanced scientific program.

Copyright: By submitting the abstract, the author(s) grants IFBLS 2022 the exclusive right to first publish the abstract and thereafter a non-exclusive right to publish, display and store the abstract in all forms, formats, and media. No fee shall be paid to the author(s) by IFBLS 2022 for the license granted herein. The author(s) will retain the copyright of his or her abstract as well.
- E. Authors who wish to withdraw their abstract should send a written request to, and abstract withdrawal is complete upon the confirmation of the secretariat.

5. Notification of Acceptance

Notification of Acceptance will be sent to authors **from August 16, 2022**, along with allocated sessions, requirements, and instructions for presentations. If your abstract is accepted, please be sure to **register by no later than August 31, 2022**. If you do not register in time, your abstract will not be included in the abstract book/USB.
